In March Adam and I decided we would start working on creative projects together. We formulated some really interesting concepts and ideas. After deliberating a submission for a particular listing and its consequential withdrawal, we decided to carry on this idea independently as artists. 2020 has been a crazy year. Initially we were looking for artists to create an 'isolation portrait', expressing the struggles of social distancing and creating a safe space for people to (anonymously if desired) share themselves, linking these together in the theme of puzzle pieces. We are individual, but we all fit together and experience the same feelings in this difficult time.

A few months ago we decided that because of the lifting of the restrictions in the UK, it would be more appropriate to rebrand the idea as a '2020 portrait' broadening the scope of possible submission themes. We decided that we could use this platform to give people a space to politically, socially and emotionally express whatever they are feeling in light of this year's events.
